



CREATIVE WRITING

Creative writing

This module covers the basics of creative writing, including the essential elements of a story, the different genres of creative writing, and practical tips and exercises for improving writing skills.

Module 1: Introduction to Creative Writing

Assignment 1: Short Story Analysis

Assignment 3: Genre Analysis

For this assignment, students will choose a genre of creative writing that they're interested in exploring further, such as poetry, memoir, or science fiction. They should read several examples of this genre and write a 2-3 page paper that analyzes the common themes, structures, and conventions of this genre.

Assignment 4: Story Starters

For this assignment, students will write 3-5 story starters that incorporate one or more of the essential elements of a story. They should share their story starters with the class and discuss which elements they include and how they could be developed into a full story.

- Shows creativity and originality in the story starters
- Demonstrates a clear understanding of the essential elements of a story
- Shows effective use of language to create engaging and memorable story starters
- Engages in productive class discussion about the story starters and how they could be developed into a full story

Assignment 5: Creative Writing Prompts

For this assignment, students will choose 3-5 creative writing prompts from a list provided by the instructor or found online. They should write a short story or scene that incorporates each prompt, using the essential elements of a story to create a compelling and memorable piece of writing. They should share their work with the class and discuss how they incorporated the prompts and elements of a story.

Evaluation Criteria:

- Incorporates each prompt effectively and creatively
- Demonstrates a clear understanding of the essential elements of a story
- Shows effective use of language to create engaging and memorable stories
- Uses clear and concise writing that effectively communicates ideas
- Engages in productive class discussion about the prompts and how they were incorporated into the writing.

Assignment: Journaling and Reflection

For this assignment, students should start a writing journal where they reflect on their personal experiences and observations. They should write for at least 10 minutes each day for a week, using the following prompts to guide their writing:

Day 1: Write about a recent experience that left you feeling happy.

Day 2: Write about a time when you felt proud of yourself.

Day 3: Write about a person who has had a significant impact on your life.

Day 4: Write about a place that holds special meaning to you.

Day 5: Write about a challenge you have overcome.

Day 6: Write about a dream or goal you have for the future.

Day 7: Reflect on the experience of journaling and what you've learned about yourself through the process.

After completing the week of journaling, students should choose one of their entries to develop into a short story, poem, or essay. They should use the essential elements of a story to create a compelling and memorable piece of writing, drawing on the sensory details and insights they gained through journaling and reflection.

Assignment: Sensory Detail and Description

For this assignment, students should write a descriptive paragraph that uses sensory details to create a vivid image of a person, place, or thing. They should focus on incorporating specific, sensory language to create a compelling and memorable description.

After completing the paragraph, students should exchange their work with a classmate and provide feedback on the use of sensory language and the effectiveness of the description. They should then revise their paragraph based on the feedback received.

Next, students should choose one of the sensory details from their revised paragraph and write a short story or scene that incorporates that detail to create a vivid image for the reader. They should use the

essential elements of a story to create a compelling and memorable piece of writing that draws on the sensory detail to create a strong sense of setting and character.

Assignment: Revising and Editing a Short Story

For this assignment, students should write a short story that incorporates the essential elements of a story. They should then revise and edit their work, following the steps of the writing process discussed in class.

First, students should read through their story and identify any major issues or areas for improvement, such as plot holes, inconsistencies, or unclear writing. They should then make a plan for revising their work, focusing on these areas.

Assignment: Exploring a New Genre

Assignment: Building a Writing Platform
